Revival and Camp Meeting

The baptism of the

Holy Spirit can revive

us again today.



It was Christmas time and Vera and I, along with our boys, were en route from Sherwood Park to Lacombe to spend the holidays with family. The temperature was 30 below, but we were prepared to travel the easy one and a half hours after dark. Although the headlights

seemed unusually dim, we did not realize our dilemma until half way to our destination the alternator warning light appeared. Service stations do not exist along this 100 km stretch and towns are significantly off the road, but it was too late to turn back. It would be a race between battery power and reaching our destination. Shortly before Ponoka, all warning signals lit up." We held our breath and prayed as minutes later we coasted into Swain's Service station for warmth, telephone, and help.

Spiritually speaking, there are times when we may be so intent on following our own agenda we are oblivi-

ous to or even ignore the warning signals that all is not well between us and our Power Source. Yet our Heavenly Father wants to fix the problem and revive us again. So it has been through all the ages of earth's history.

To the antidiluvians, God sent the patriarchs; to the Israelites in the wilderness-in the time of Moses, He gave His "Good Spirit" to instruct them (Nehemiah 9:20); and throughout the Old Testament, he sent the prophets. For the early New Testament church He promised "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). That promise was fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost when "they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them" (Acts 2:1-4).

This baptism of the Holy Spirit brought about a huge revival. Conversion led people to cry out, "What shall we do?" and 3000 were baptized in one day. What a revival! This same Spirit upheld the Waldensians through the dark ages, the Reformers through the middle ages, and the pioneers during the Great Awakening.

The baptism of the Holy Spirit can revive us again today. In Acts of the Apostles pages 53 and 54, Ellen White describes it this way:

"And today God is still using His church to make known His purpose in the earth. Today the heralds of the cross are going from city to city, and from land to land, preparing the way for the second advent of Christ...And as they continue to let their light shine, as did those who were baptized with the Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, they receive more and more of the Spirit's power... The outpouring of the Spirit in the days of the apostles was the beginning of the early or

former rain, and glorious was the result. To the end of time the presence of the Spirit is to abide with the true church.

"But near the close of earth's harvest, a special bestowal of spiritual grace is promised to prepare the church for the coming of the Son of man...

"But unless the members of God's church today have a living connection with the Source of all spiritual growth, they will not be ready for the time of reaping...Only those who are constantly receiving fresh supplies of grace, will have power proportionate to their daily need and ability to use that power."

Revival is so essential at this time. Our Camp Meeting theme is "Revive Us ... Again." Maybe our "lights" are growing dim. Maybe there are warning signals we're choosing to ignore. Would this not be a good time to "wheel in" and reconnect with the Power Source and be re-baptized with the Holy Spirit?

Simply Raw Un-Cooking Seminar

Peers Company hosted a screening of the documentary *Simply Raw: Reversing Diabetes in 30 Days* for our community on February 20. The film chronicles six people with diabetes who travelled to the Tree of Life Rejuvenation Center in Patagonia, Arizona, and switched to a vegan, organic, uncooked food diet for 30 days. The results were remarkable. All were able to come off all medications including insulin within days after making the lifestyle change.

The Peers Company invited Janet Thomsen from the Whitecourt Company to conduct a Simply Raw Un-cooking Seminar on March 27. Thirty—five people attended and more are on the waiting list.

The menu includes dishes such as Chia breakfast pudding, cream of zucchini soup, Nut Tuna Pate, a "macaroni" and "cheese" dish using raw spaghetti and a nut sauce, coconut ice cream and lemon pie – all without dairy, sugar, or being cooked



yet absolutely delicious. People took second and third helpings, fascinated that uncooked food could be so appetizing.

One family who started the "uncooked" food program reported that their 11-year old diabetic son's insulin dosage could be reduced to the point where he no longer needed the night-time dose. His medical doctor concluded the boy had started producing his own insulin. Others on the diet reported similar results.

The newspaper provided favourable publicity for the event.

The Peers Company hosted their second session on May 15, and with only word of mouth advertising, had a full class.

In the past 5 years in Alberta over 20 church groups have begun. I want to commend conference leadership and particularly the passion of Elder John Adams for his inspiration in this area. How can we continue having a strong growing work in Alberta?

Church Planting is important but must be accompanied with many other aspects of church ministry and outreach. Raising up new churches must also be done strategically and with careful planning. Strong new churches are generally developed cooperatively with spon-

soring churches. New churches are then the result of mission orientated parent churches. Church planting through church splits usually doesn't engender a strong work. It takes good leadership and a strong nucleus of mission focused members to develop a strong new work.

Alberta needs representation of our work in many parts of cities, with many people groups and communities throughout Alberta. This must be done prayerfully and with networks of people combining their talents and resources to make it happen. The conference and churches are seeking the best plans to develop strong new work in this great conference. God has blessed us by sending many people to our province, let's honor thin by being missionaries in evangelizing them and raising new churches to the Glory of God.
