met an interesting guy named Ron the other day at a swimming pool. Let me tell you about him.

After a day of meetings, Becky suggested that we



go for a swim in the motel pool before we ate supper. I was surprised to find a lifeguard watching over the pool, and while Becky swam, he and I talked. He wanted to know why I was in town. I told him that I worked for the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Right then, he held up the book he was reading. It turned out to be the Desire of

Ages. He had attended an Adventist church only once in his life. But from that experience he had discovered a lot about what Adventists believe, and he also discov-

ered his favorite books: the one he was reading, Steps to Christ, and Christ's Object Lessons.

I became interested in swimming. In fact, for a week I was about as faithful a swimmer as I could be. Ron and I talked about

Jesus every evening that week. We also talked about the stock market, the US election, living conditions, and a lot of other things. One of these days, I expect that Ron will worship again in an Adventist church, and I hope that when he does that church is a place that welcomes people who are growing in Christ.

Meeting Ron made me think about the opportunities all around us right now. People today are looking for lope and help. That's what Jesus offers. Surrounding us at work, at school, in our families, and our neighbour-

hoods, are people who need hope. You and I can offer that to them. We can talk with them about Jesus.

The Christmas season gives us an opportunity to mention Jesus in conversations. True, many people have lost touch with the Christian aspect of the holidays, but we need to keep talking about Jesus. God's Plan—The Best for Bruno Baseotto

"On November 8th, 2008, I made a statement to the world by being baptized.

My journey has taken me 48 years to give my life to Christ. At the age of 21, I started playing hockey. I had everything the world could offer. I had money, car, house, prestige, and fame. At the age of 33, I turned from playing and started my coaching career. A year later my world came crashing down. My wife left, and I lost everything—my family and my worldly possessions. The Lord was taking care of me, even though at the time I didn't realize it. I coached professionally in Europe for three years, after which I was offered a coaching job in Saskatoon in the WHL, where I met my present wife (happily married). I coached there for four years and also coached one year in Tri-Cities in the WHL.

After five years of coaching, I decided to get out of hockey. With the support of my wife, we returned to Calgary; we both found jobs and bought a house. When we settled down in Calgary, I felt something was missing in my life.

My wife and I often like to drive to Kalispell, Montana, about two or three times a year. We enjoy the beauty and nature it has to offer. On one of our visits, we were shopping in K-Mart. I felt a pulling. I can't explain it. Anyway, I bought a Bible and told my wife I would be in the car waiting for her to finish shopping. I started reading in the car. Genesis caught my attention about the Sabbath—it just hit me so hard about the truth and I couldn't deny it.

When we arrived back in Calgary, I started taking

an online Bible Study Course with Amazing Facts. Each day I would be finding new truth. I was getting a divine education.

After much prayer, reading the Bible, and soul searching, I decided to go to the Calgary Southside Seventh day Adventist Church. I enjoyed my first visit to the church. The people were loving, caring, and friendly.

That night, a year and a half ago, we took our son to the hospital. The following evening he passed away. I don't know why he had to pass away, but I do know we have to trust and believe in the Lord. His thoughts are higher than ours.

As time passed, I still continued to read the Bible. I found comfort in God's Word. I always had a fond memory of my first visit to the Calgary Southside Church. The warmth, the caring, the loving, was something special. I returned to the church four months after the passing of our son.

Three weeks ago I was asked if I could do a Bible study lesson for Sabbath school. I said, 'Yes.' The next Sabbath, the pastor of our church asked if I would be interested in being baptised and become a teacher. I said, 'Yes' with great joy.

I truly believe that God has a plan for me, and has a plan for all of our lives. Jeremiah 29:11 is a special verse to me that I hold in my heart: 'For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, the thoughts of peace, and not evil, to give you an expected end.'"

GIFT OF CASH

Cash is the simplest and most common form of gift and the gift is complete when the cheque is hand-delivered or mailed to the conference. The Official Tax Receipt is for the face amount of the cash donation. However, in certain circumstances, cash may not be the best way to make a gift. Please contact one of the individuals listed here to discuss the following donation options:

GIFT OF APPRECIATED SECURITIES

Publicly Listed Securities that have gained in value and that are transferred to the conference without first being sold are not subject to Capital Gains Tax. The Official Receipt for Income Tax Purposes is the value of the shares when received by the conference.

GIFT OF LIFE INSURANCE

A donor who transfers ownership of a paid-up life insurance policy to the conference, and names the conference as the irrevocable beneficiary of the policy, receives an Official Tax Receipt for any cash surrender value of the paid up policy. A donor may irrevocably transfer ownership to the conference of a policy where the donor continues to make payments, either annually or in one lump sum. Donors of these partially paid up policies receive a tax receipt for any current cash surrender value of the policy, and tax receipts for ongoing premium payments, either annual or lump sum.

GIFT OF REAL ESTATE

A gift of real estate is complete when a deed conveying the property to the charity is signed and delivered; however, the conference needs to be contacted prior to the transfer to ensure all requirements are met, such as a Certified Appraisal acceptable for purposes of the Official Tax Receipt.

CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

A more mature donor who wishes to receive a periodic income payment for life, or for a specified term, and who would also like to make a charitable donation, may wish to consider a Charitable Gift Annuity.

DONATIONS FOR 2008 OFFICIAL TAX RECEIPTS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY DECEMBER 31, 2008.


